The DLM Forum is seeking participants and contributors to our next members meeting, in **Brussels** on **27-28 May 2024**.

Our theme is "Archiving Europe's Digital Decade".

Looking ahead to 2030, Europe aims to empower businesses and people in a human-centred, sustainable and more prosperous digital future. With data and records underpinning so much of the brave new digital world, how do information managers, archivists, technologists, and policy makers share knowledge,

As we are meeting in Brussels, we are seeking contributors both from the policy perspective, and also from practitioners, with real world projects and experiences. We want to unlock new connections across our two tracks of **Policy** and **Practice**, within the overarching theme of **Archiving Europe's Digital Decade**.

We are primarily seeking proposals for presentations covering both policy and practical aspects of digital transformation, record keeping, and digital archiving. However, the final programme may also include opportunities for panel discussions and workshops.

We are especially keen to explore new avenues and hear fresh perspectives – about both the technology and the human issues involved. If you're working in this area but have never been to the DLM Forum before, please do consider joining us in Brussels and contributing.

We will be meeting at the National Archives of Belgium in **Brussels** on **27-28 May 2024**. The event will be happening in person, i.e. **contributors will need to attend in real life**. We hope to record or stream presentations and talks.
